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

- Passable by stock and 2WD vehicles, improved dirt, gravel etc.
 - Scenic, touring trail ride; four-wheel drive required occasionally, some mud holes or rocks that would stop most other vehicles are traveled easily in 4WD.
 - For novice and experienced drivers alike; the most fun four-wheeling you can expect to have in a stock four-wheeler; low range may be required often.
 - Not advisable for novice drivers; potentially dangerous situations; maximum ground clearance, lowest gears, lockers, limited slips, winches, and jacks advised due to moderate to large rocks and obstacles, vehicle damage possible. Full size vehicles limited to specific trails at this rating.

Duties of Office

In accordance with The Roughwheelers IV Wheel Drive Club "Standard Operating Procedures", from now until the end of the year, I will be including the descriptions of each officer's duties for the nominations and elections in November and December for 2016.

Secretary:

- 6. Act as host/hostess for the guests during the meeting.
- 7. Maintain guest log at meetings, and supplies guest information to editor.
- 8. Maintain new member's notebook and contents (patch, camping guide, by-laws, roster, telephone tree, and membership questionnaires.
- 9. Maintain new member's questionnaires.
- 10. May obtain more notebooks or notebook supplies when needed.
- 11. Maintain supply of all club forms.
- 12. Mail a copy of the board meeting minutes to officers and members who attend only.

Treasurer:

- 1. Maintain all club fiscal records.
- 2. Collect annual dues for CA4WDC.
- 3. Pay annual dues to CA4WDC for Roughwheelers' members in good standing.
- 4. Maintain club bank account.
- 5. Obtain necessary forms from CA4WDC for any fiscal matters.
- 6. Maintain signature card from bank.
- 7. Present a verbal report at each meeting.
- 8. Announce delinquent dues at each meeting. Collect dues at each meeting break. Maintain all records pertaining to club dues.
- 9. Can sign all club checks independently.
- 10. Distribute CA4WDC membership cards and dash plaques.
- 11. Pay post office box rent when due, before December 31st each year.

Trip Report to The Rubicon Trail

There were 4 rigs that met up in Placerville on Wednesday evening and got a room for the night, and then met up with Avi and Roni on Thursday am for the trip to the trailhead.

Attendees were Avi, Roni, Dennis Fevergeon, Wes Hoffmaster, David Master and yours truly, Chips.

We stopped at Ice House Resort to leave Dave's tow ring and continued on. We were eventually stopped as they were repaving the road into Loon Lake, had a 20 min stop until a pilot vehicle guided us into the dam/trail head.

We aired down and took a few pics and started our run. Before even reaching the gatekeeper, Dave's jeep backfired and lost power. We checked all the possible things but still

no luck in getting it running. I towed him back to the staging area and decided to go back to get his tow rig and get him on the trailer as he was done and heading home. I took him back to Ice House Resort. We found out later that the "brain" (ECM) failed. The remaining group started at about 3:30pm and continued until we found a place to camp. The weather was great but no campfires allowed, so we all turned in fairly early.

Friday up early and hit the trail, did not see anyone else until we started defending the granite slabs down towards Buck Island Lake. There were about 20 rigs from a motor home club going east to Little Sluice. After they passed, Avi sheared a valve stem off a front tire, so we got him in a safe spot to make a tire change and proceeded on with the night's camp being in Rubicon Springs. Next we entered Big Sluice spotting the rigs thru the obstacles around the big trees. Wes got into a spot and got a slight scratch on his passenger door before we got him out and onto a different line. Everyone made it thru with little or no problems. We crossed over Rubicon River Bridge and Avi went a little to far to the passenger side on the exit ramp and drove off the side getting himself hung up. Guys behind us tried to winch him back to no avail, so he winched himself forward and pretty soon into Rubicon Springs and then to our camp spot (same as the last time), except this time the water was very deep. We heard heavers had dammed up further down river; crossing high water like that always makes me nervous.

We set up camp after a long day and watched the moon rise up over the Holland. We all turned in after a long day.

Saturday morning we were up early and left camp being the first ones up Cadillac Hill, we strapped a couple of the rigs on one spot as it was pretty torn up as they just had the Jeep Jamborees over the last couple weekends. We met some guys at the top waiting for us to clear and then continued on to the end where we aired up. Shortly afterwards the RV club all starting arriving, so we left at a good time on Saturday am.

After airing up, I left the group and went to visit my sister. Thanks to all for making it a great successful trip.



CALIFORNIA FOUR WHEEL DRIVE ASSOCIATION, INC.

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- High Sierra Poker Run was cancelled due to the smoke and road closures that have resulted from the Rough Fire.
- Barret 4WD Lake Trail reopened July 23, 2015. This is a rugged 6-mile off-highway route from Wright's Lake to Barrett Lake, just west of Desolation Wilderness now that reconstruction has been completed on 3 segments of the trail to protect sensitive meadows. This trail has been used by recreationists since the 1960s and offers one of the most challenging off-highway (OHV) experiences in the Sierra Nevada. The trail has a high rating for difficulty and is only recommended for very experienced OHV users prepared for remote travel over large rocks. Motorized travel on this trail is typically at a rate of approx. 1-2 miles per hour.

The Barrett 4WD Trail was identified as one of 18 routes in the Eldorado National Forest travel system, which needed corrections to comply with the environmental protection guidelines in the Sierra Nevada Plan. These routes were closed in 2012 to complete further analysis and make corrections to ensure the hydrologic connectivity of meadows would not be significantly impacted by motorized vehicle use.

- Cal4Wheel decals are now available.
